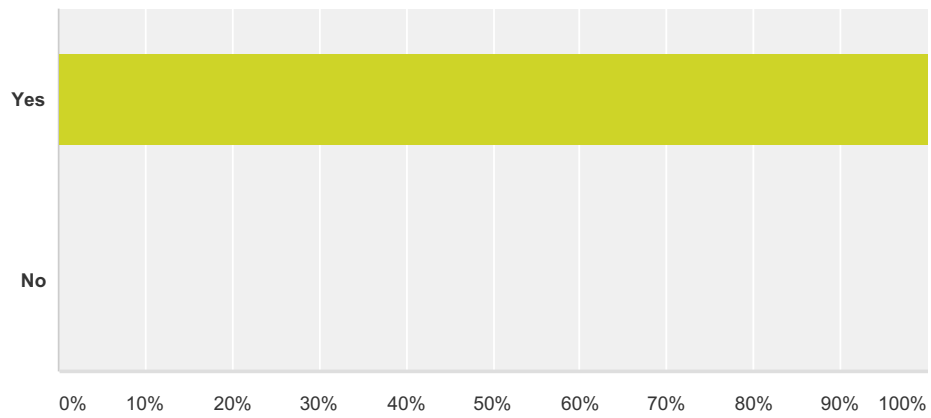


Q1 Were the printed learning aims/objectives of the workshops met?

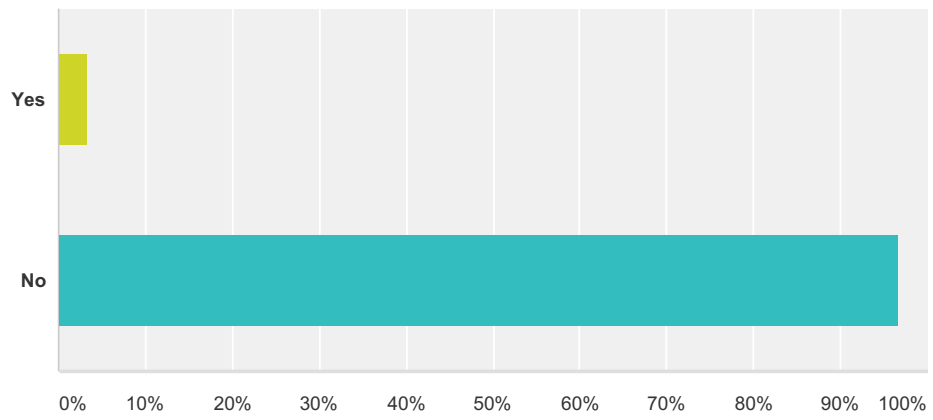

Q2 Was there any bias or conflict of interest in the course?

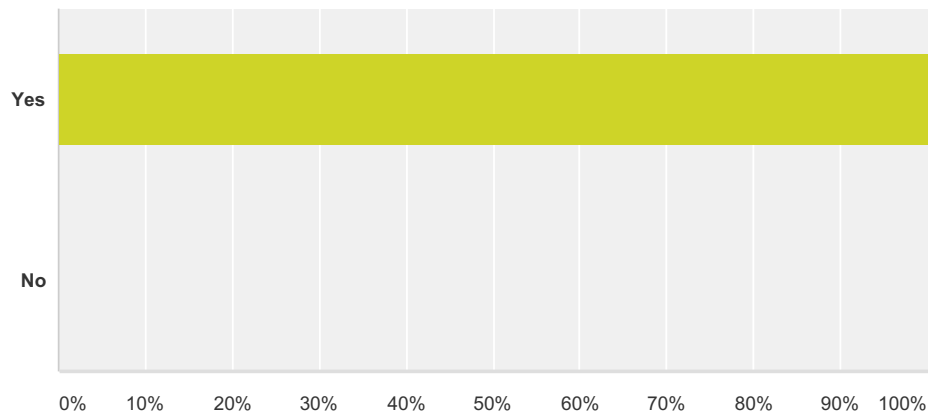

Q3 Were the speakers/instructors knowledgeable?

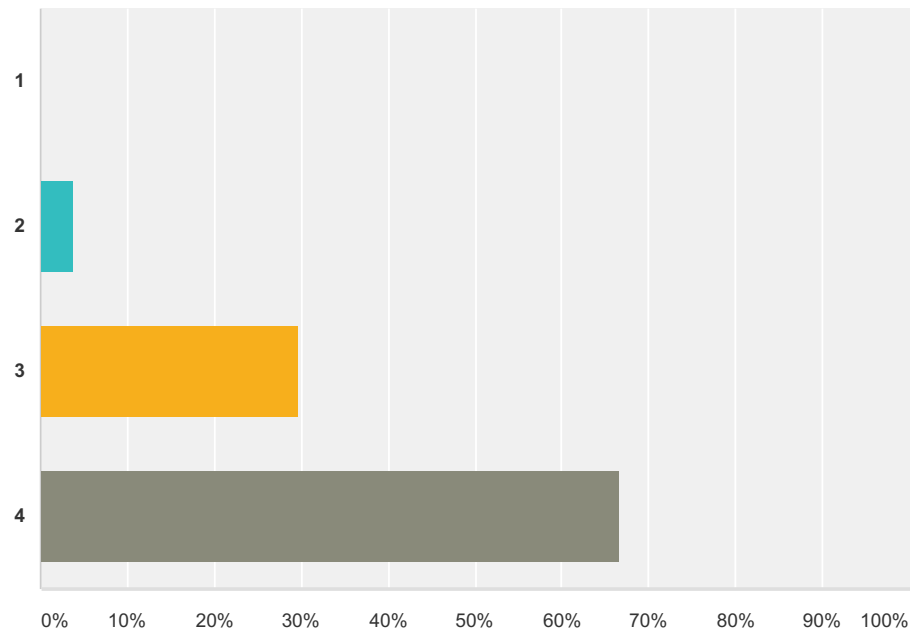

Q4 How would you rate the CPD activity to your educational needs

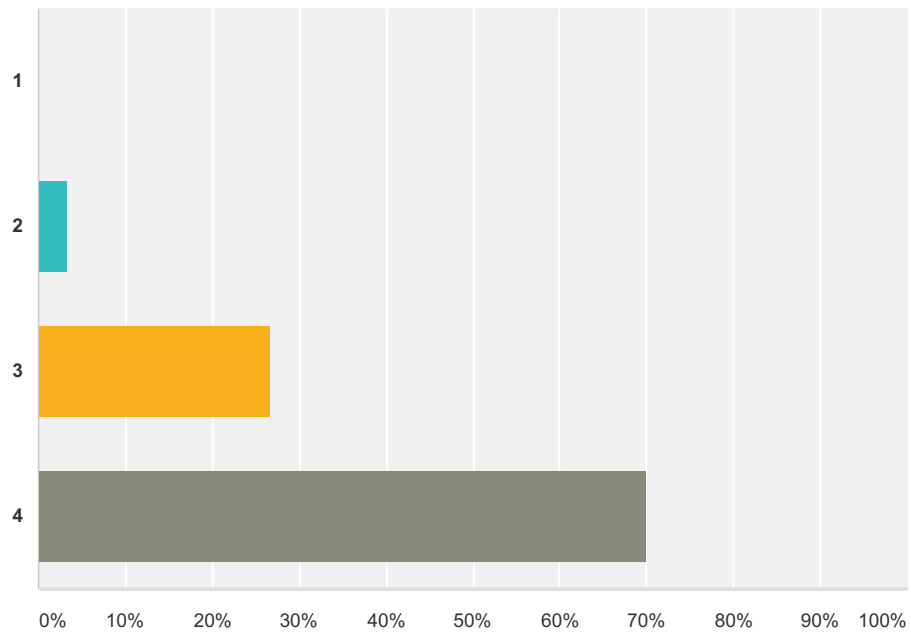

Q5 How do you rate the overall quality of the education offered by this meeting?

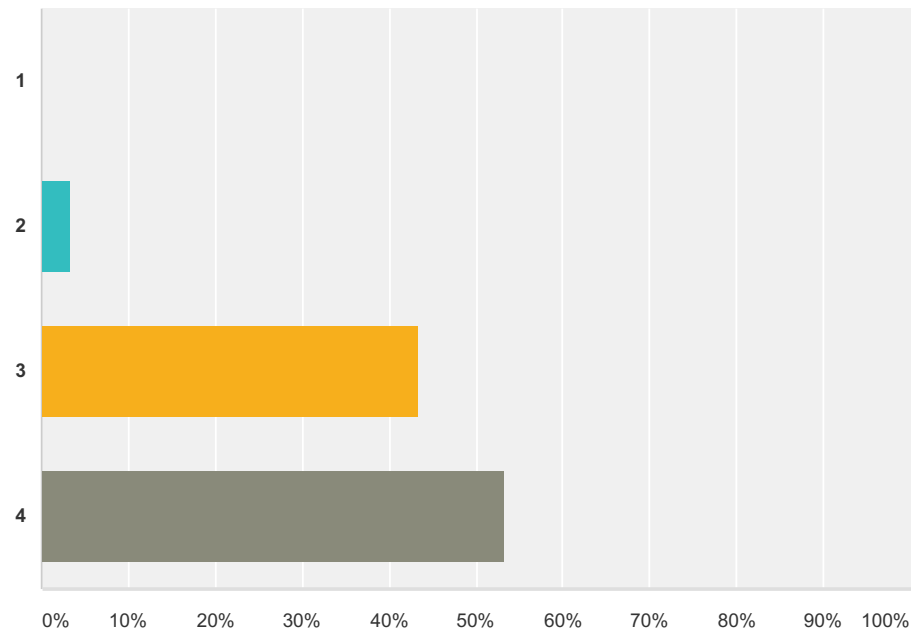

Q6 How do you rate the effectiveness of this educational activity for CPD purposes?

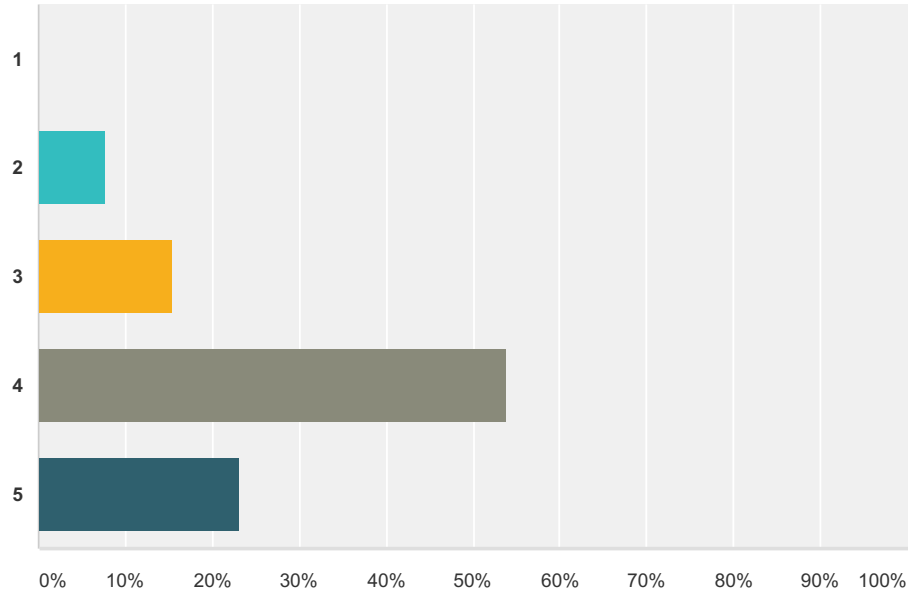

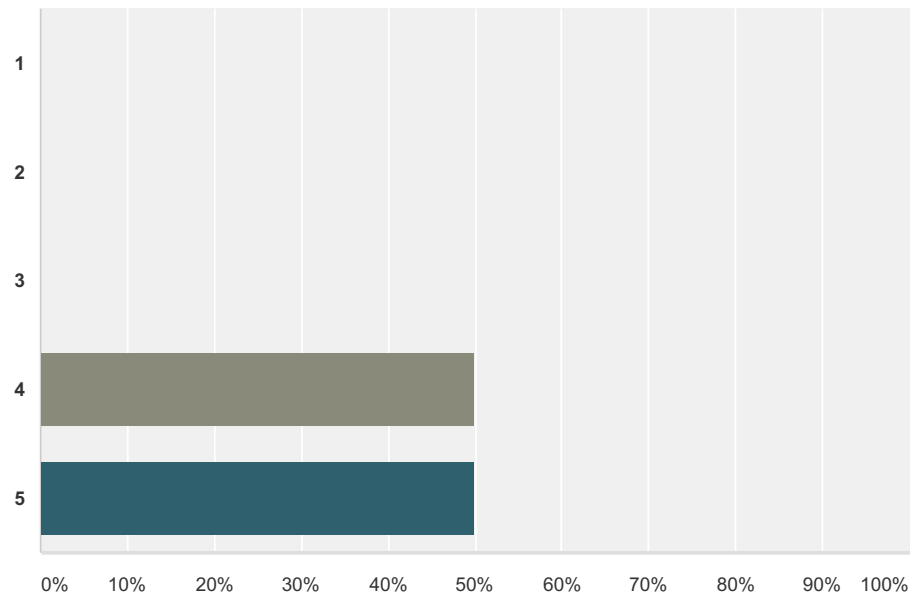

Q8 How did you rate the scenario A Difficult Resuscitation SF/SB/KE

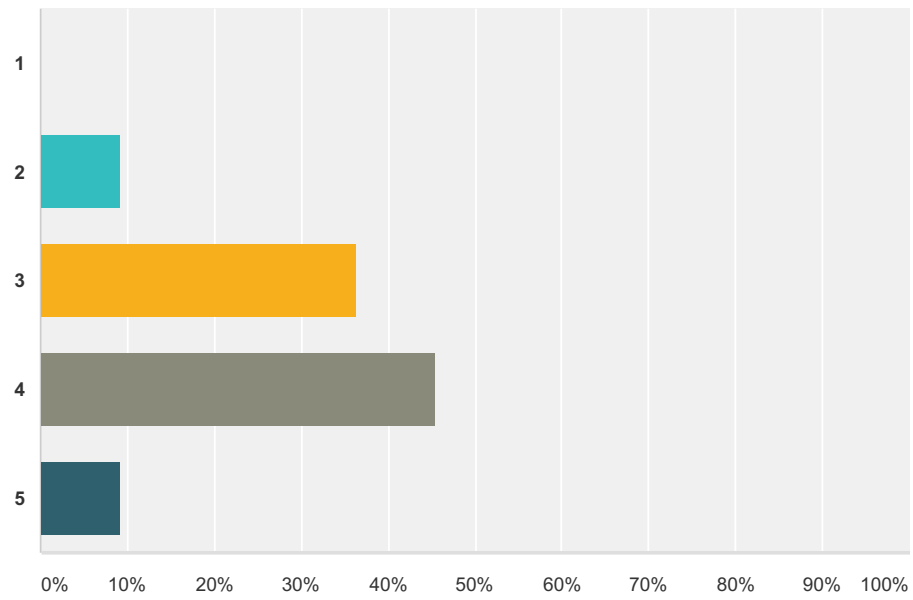

Q9 How did you rate the scenario A Difficult Situation

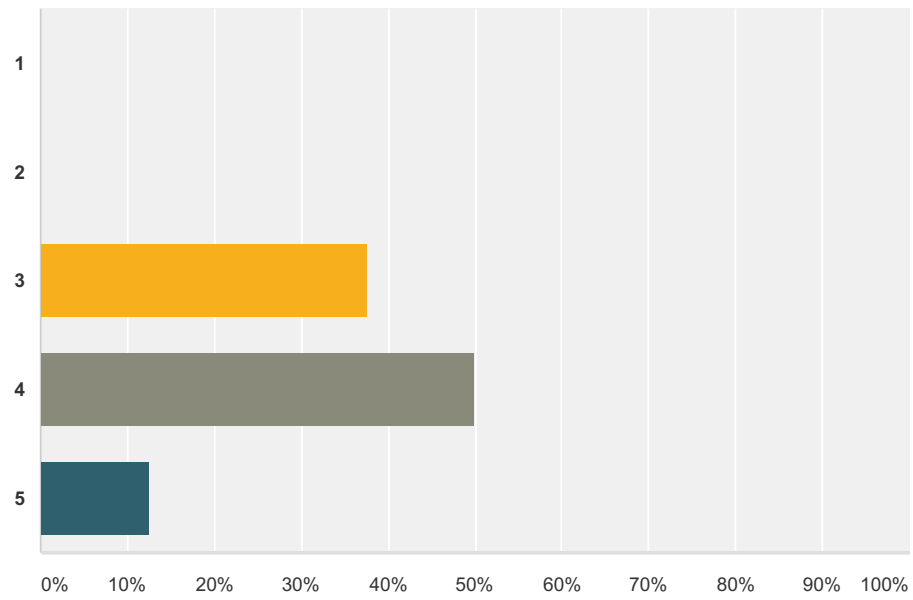

Q10 How did you rate the scenario Differing Opinions? RI/DW/RG/KE

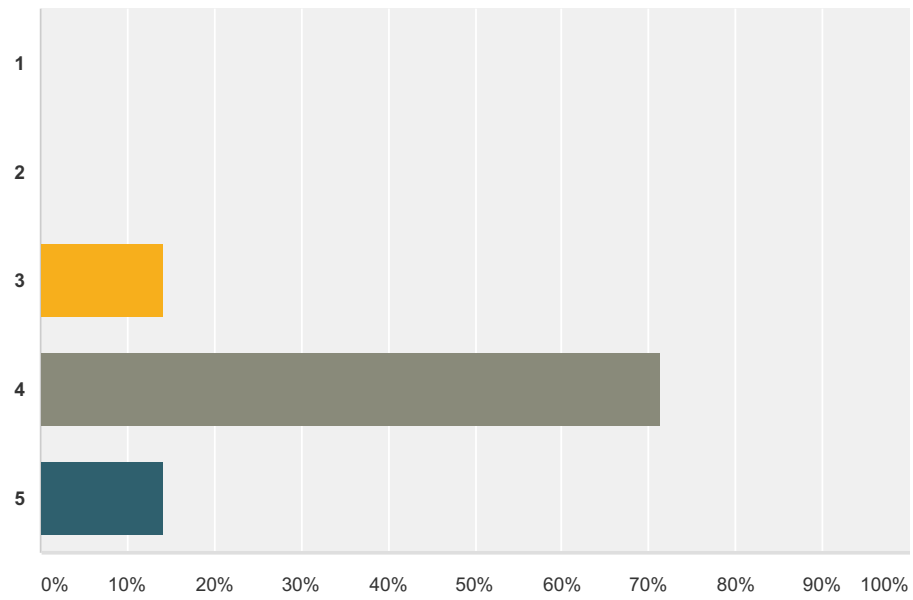

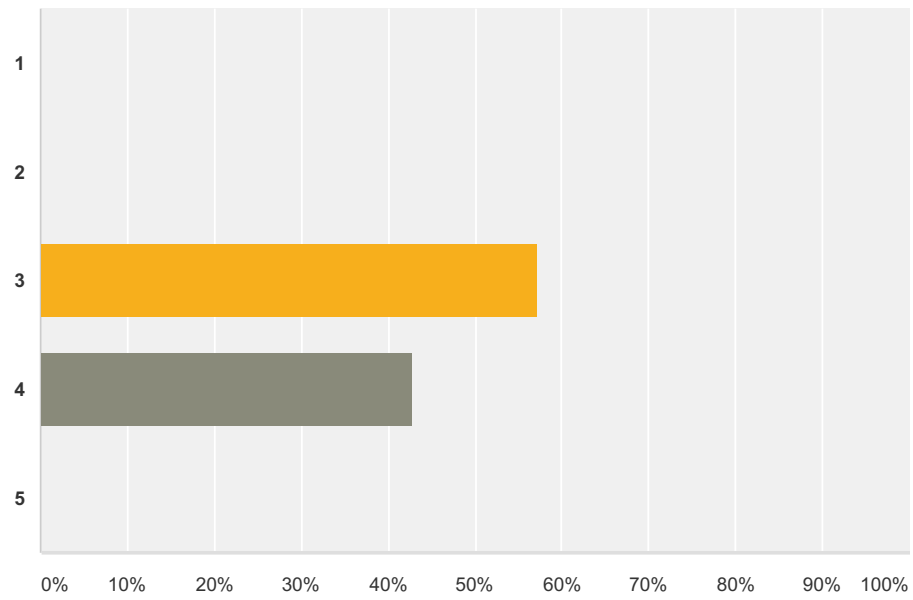

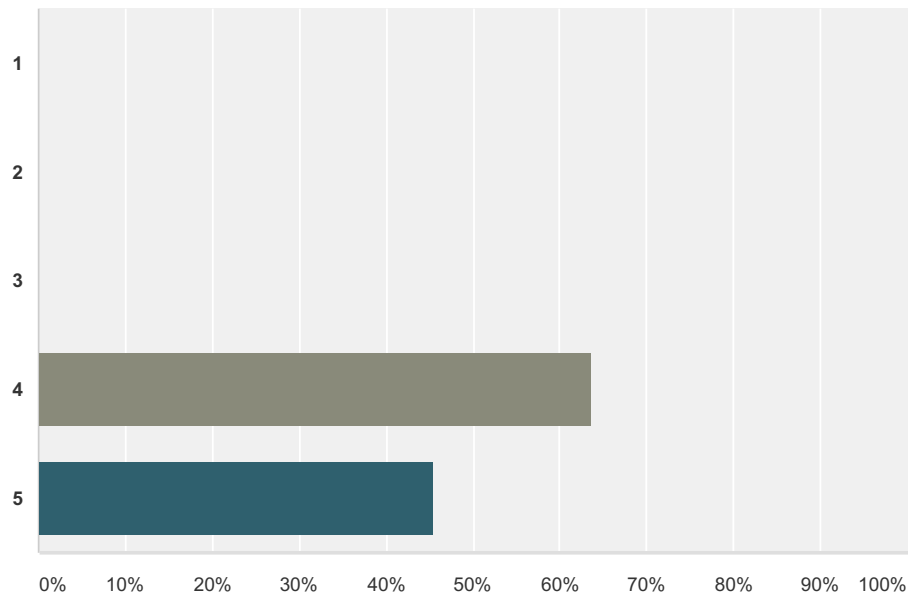

Q13 How did you rate the scenario Expert Opinions? AS/SB

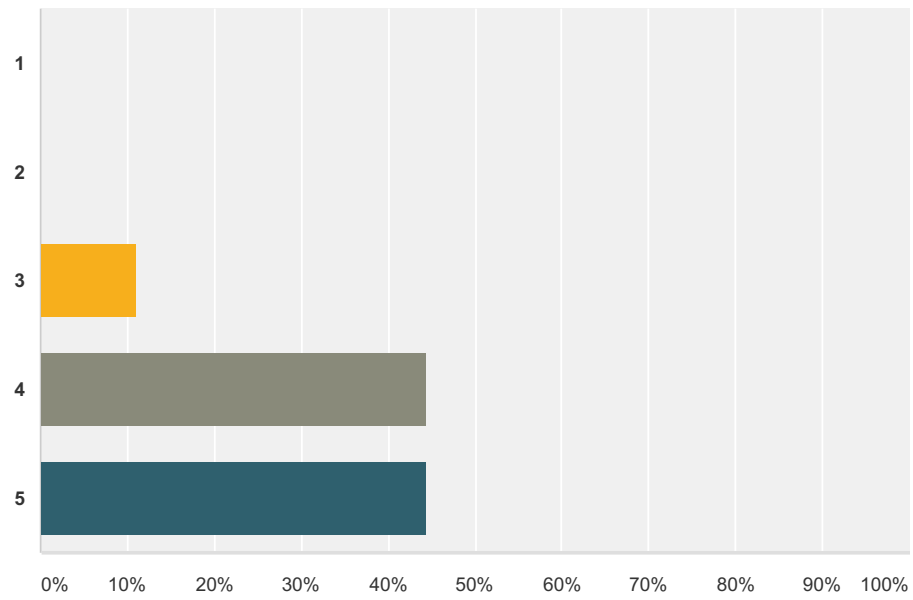

Q14 How did you rate the scenario An Issue of Faith AS/RG

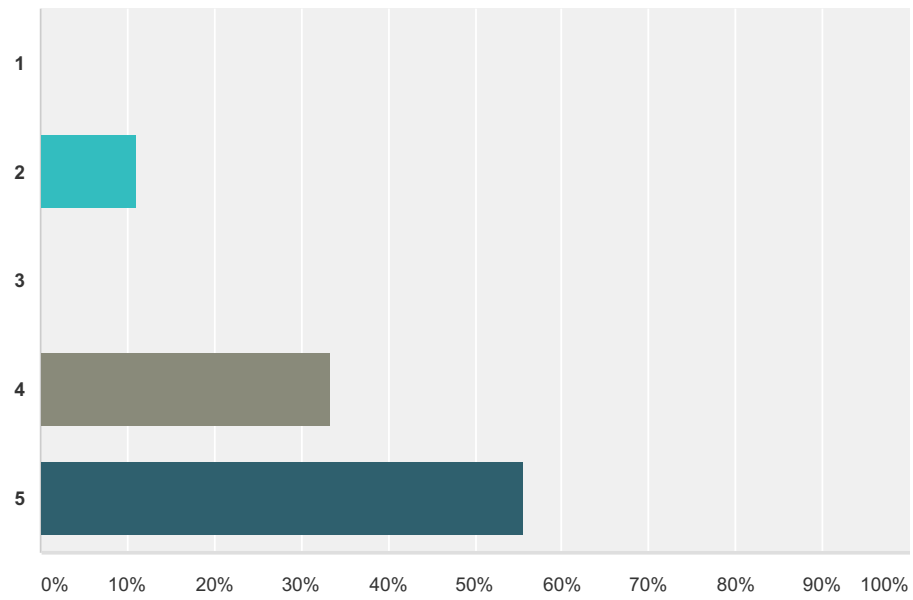
