Q4 How worthwhile was the course material?

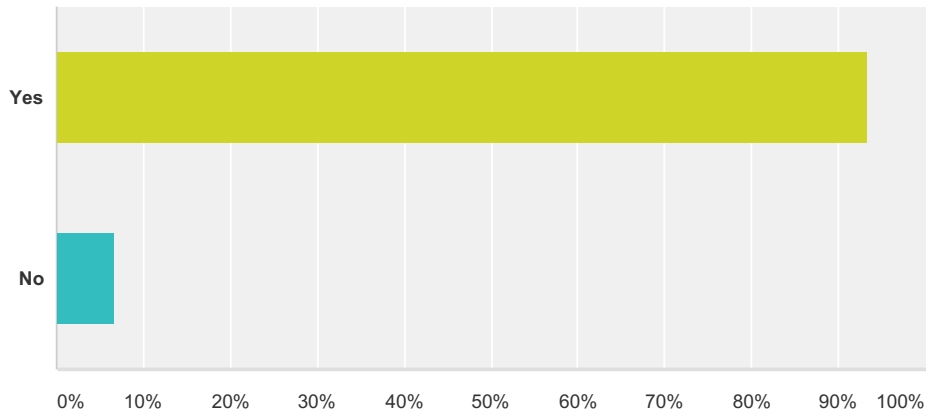

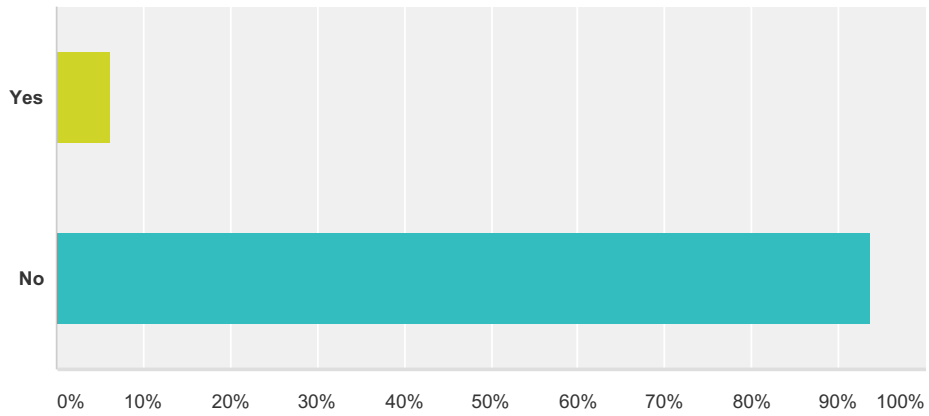

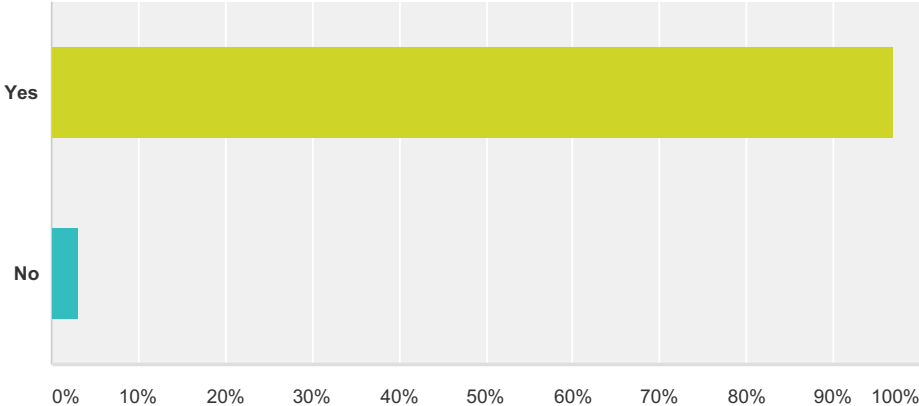

Q16 How do you rate the overall quality of the education offered by this meeting

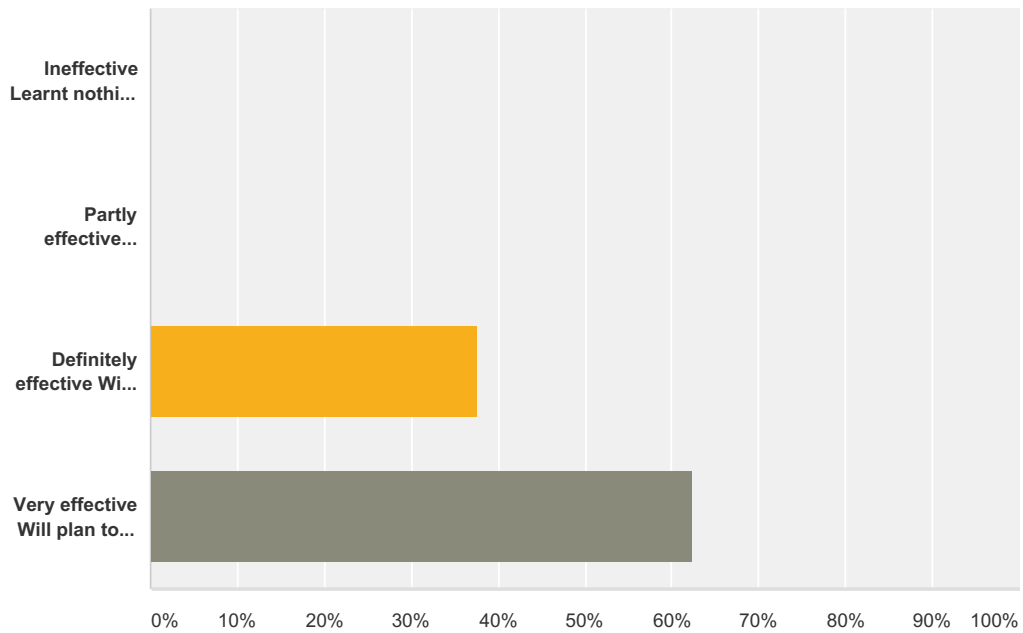

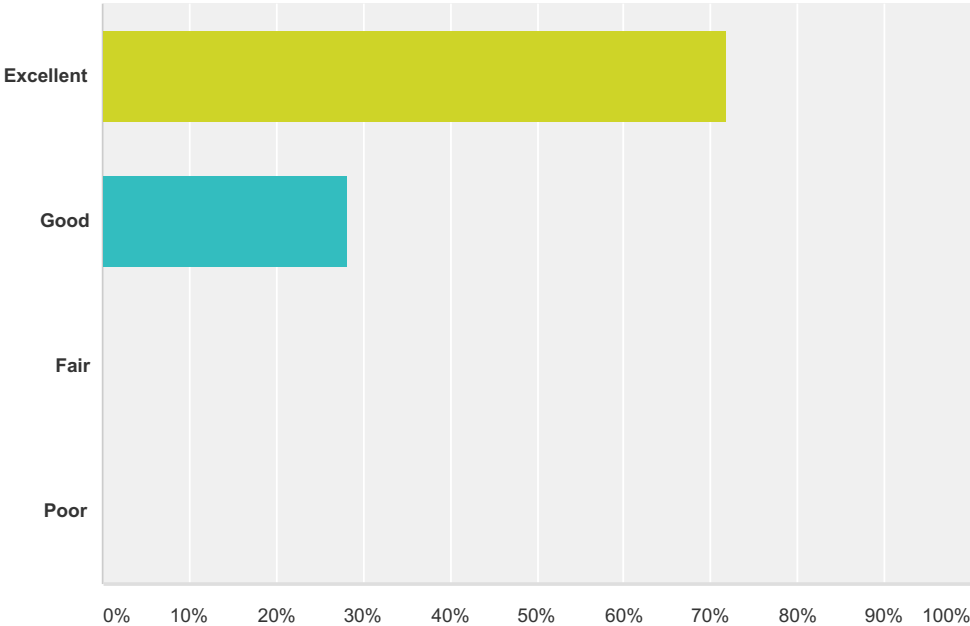

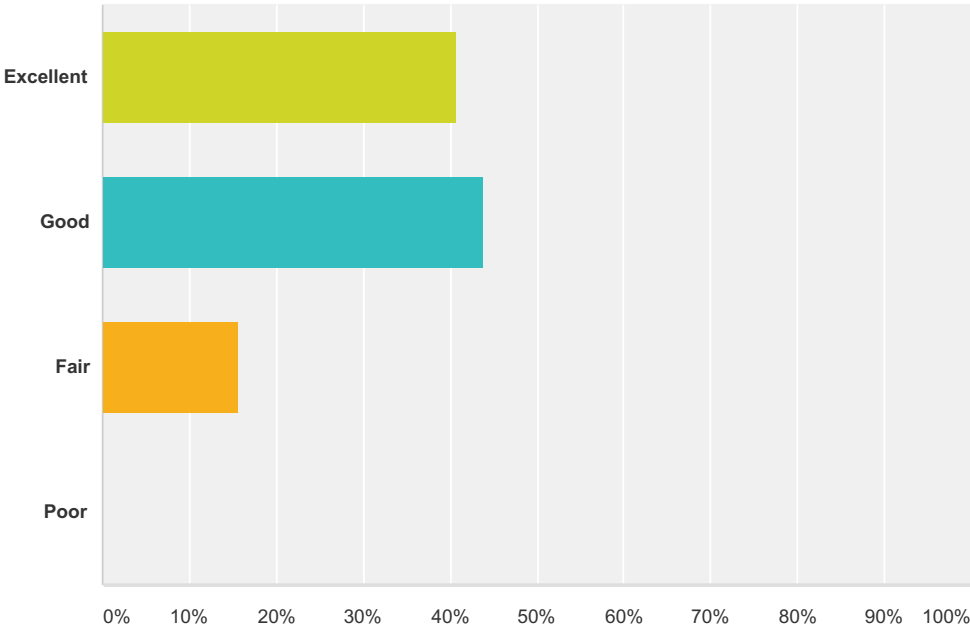
