All trainees looking to train in Paediatrics overseas or work as a career paediatrician don't know where to start and can spend a huge amount of time procrastinating. Please note we can only provide a framework of how to go about this. It is impossible to provide extremely detailed information regarding immigration and license to practice requirements in each individual country. For that prospective candidates are expected to contact the Royal colleges and the medical registration authorities as well as Immigration authorities to clarify the exact requirements. These requirements can change at short notice, and it is up to candidates to keep themselves abreast of the latest changes in this regard.

A rough approach is first to decide where you want to train and look at the different pathways in that country for entry. A key question is are you looking for a license to practice in a job (non-training job) or are you looking to train towards becoming a consultant paediatrician with a license to practice in that country. Both jobs can provide an overseas experience that might benefit individual candidates based on their individual circumstances.
